You have the right to:

- Reach your full learning potential in a safe and supportive environment
- Be safe
- Be treated with respect, courtesy, and kindness
- Be an active voice and contribute positively to the community
- Be treated fairly and justly
- Have your human rights, and other legal rights respected.

You have the responsibility to:

- Enable others to learn in a safe and supportive environment
- Follow the Centre's policies, procedures and the directions of staff
- Work within the Four Principles
- Treat others with respect, courtesy, and kindness
- Represent the Centre well in the community
- Consider the impact of your actions and take ownership
- Respect the human rights and legal rights of others.

Building Common Ground

At the Flexi, we use the four principles so that the rights of everyone in the community is respected.

The Four Principles are:

RESPECT

HONESTY

SAFE & LEGAL

PARTICIPATION

These principles guide relationships both with each other and in groups. They are used by everyone in the community to encourage learning, build relationships, and resolve differences.



This is called a working agreement



These conversations are important as they allow a safe space for everyone to talk and share their thoughts and feelings.

This is the way that everyone in the community including adults and young people are responsible for their actions and behaviours. We call this Common Ground.
